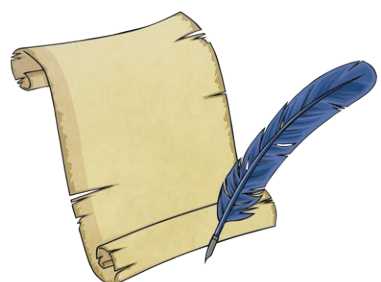
Write a postcard to your family about you being on a magical escape. Make sure to include where you are, what you have done, who you have seen and what is so magical about the place you're in.
